

AGM 2021 Sequence of Events:

An email was sent out to all clubs on March 26, 2021 explaining that due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the AGM would not be held as a group function as per usual and asked the clubs to vote on the ability to hold the AGM by email vote.

**Moved by Greg Grant, Zone 4 Director, Seconded by Stacey Noddin, Club # 67 :
The following motion was voted on by the NBFSC Snowmobile Clubs on March 26, 2021 and was passed with 146 YAY votes, representing 36 clubs:**

Be it moved that the 2021 NBFSC Annual General Meeting be conducted electronically this year only, because of the worldwide Covid-19 Pandemic and that all voting of critical business items will be conducted electronically with all Member Clubs between May 3rd, 2021 ending by May 17th, 2021 so our companies business can proceed which will enable us to be normally prepared for the 2021-2022 season, which in most cases unofficially begins by Labor Day which is September 6th, 2021 this year.

The following motion was voted on by the NBFSC Snowmobile Clubs on May 3, 2021 and was passed with 127 YAY votes, representing 35 clubs:**

“Be it moved that the 2022 NBFSC’s Pre-Season Classic Trail Permit cost \$105.00 per permit, plus HST, as a pre-season incentive selling price on or before December 15th 2021.”

“Be it moved that the 2022 NBFSC’s Classic Trail Permit cost \$155.00 per permit, plus HST, as the regular selling price after December 15th 2021.”

The following motion was voted on by the NBFSC Snowmobile Clubs on May 6, 2021 and was passed with 135 YAY votes, representing 34 clubs:

“Be it moved that the 2022 NBFSC’s **Pre-Season Trail Permit** cost \$185.00 per permit, plus HST, as a pre-season incentive selling price on or before December 15th 2021.”

“Be it moved that the 2022 NBFSC’s **Seasonal Trail Permit** cost \$265.00 per permit, plus HST, as the regular selling price after December 15th 2021.”

“Be it moved that the 2022 NBFSC’s **Antique Trail Permit** cost \$60.00 per permit, plus HST, as the regular selling price all season.”

“Be it moved that the 2022 NBFSC’s **Family (1st & 2nd) Trail Permit** cost \$265.00 per permit, plus HST, as the regular selling price after December 15th 2020 and cost \$185.00 per permit, plus HST, as a sales incentive selling price before December 15th 2021.”

“Be it moved that the 2022 NBFSC’s **Family (3rd, 4th etc...) Trail Permit** cost \$105.00 per permit, plus HST, as the regular selling price all season.”

“Be it moved that the 2022 NBFSC’s **Dealer Trail Permit** cost \$265.00 per permit, plus HST, as the regular selling price after December 15th 2021 and cost \$185.00 per permit, plus HST, as a sales incentive selling price before December 15th 2021.”

“Be it moved that the 2022 NBFSC’s **Late Season Trail Permit** cost \$185.00 per permit, plus HST, as a late-season incentive selling price after December 15th 2021, for those who have purchased a snowmobile at an authorized dealership – available through the NBFSC office only.”

“Be it moved that the 2022 NBFSC’s **Replacement Trail Permit** cost \$20.00 per permit, HST included, as the regular selling price for the complete season.”

“Be it moved that the 2022 NBFSC’s **One-Day Trail Permit** cost \$40.00 per permit, HST included, for the complete season.”

“Be it moved that the 2022 NBFSC’s **Two-Day Trail Permit** cost \$60.00 per permit, HST included, for the complete season.”

“Be it moved that the 2022 NBFSC’s **Three-Day Trail Permit** cost \$80.00 per permit, HST included, for the complete season”.

“Be it moved that the 2022 NBFSC’s **Four-Day Trail Permit** cost \$100.00 per permit, HST included, for the complete season.”

“Be it moved that the 2022 NBFSC’s **Five-Day Trail Permit** cost \$120.00 per permit, HST included, for the complete season.”

“Be it moved that the 2022 NBFSC’s **Six-Day Trail Permit** cost \$140.00 per permit, HST included, for the complete season.”

“Be it moved that the 2022 NBFSC’s **Seven -Day Trail Permit** cost \$160.00 per permit, HST included, for the complete season.”

“Be it moved that the 2022 NBFSC’s **200cc Snowmobile Trail Permit** cost \$105.00 per permit, plus HST, as the regular selling price all season.”

The following motion was voted on by the NBFSC Snowmobile Clubs on May 7, 2021 and was passed with 122 YAY votes and 14 NAY votes, representing 33 clubs:

The following motion was voted on by the NBFSC Snowmobile Clubs on May 12, 2021 and was passed with 142 YAY votes and 6 NAY votes, representing 37 clubs:

“Be it moved that NBFSC By-Law Article 1 be changed to the following:

The name of the association will be “The New Brunswick Federation of Snowmobile Clubs, Inc.”, and/or “La Fédération des Clubs de Motoneige du Nouveau-Brunswick, Inc.”, hereinafter referred to as the “Federation”. The association will operate as “Snowmobile-Motoneige NB”.

The four Zones that needed to have Director elections this year were Zones 1, 3, 5 & 7. A call for nominations was first sent out to each zone on April 2, 2021, a second call for nominations was sent out on May 19, 2021 and a third call for nominations was sent out on May 20, 2021.
