# NB FEDERATION OF SNOWMOBILE CLUBS POLICY STATEMENTS

**ADM-005**

**LOTTERY**

## **I. GENERAL**

As a means of raising funds for both the Federation and its member clubs, the Federation shall annually conduct a lottery. The purpose of this policy is to establish the procedures under which this lottery is conducted.

## **II. PRIZES**

The General Manager, in conjunction with the Board of Directors shall establish the list of prizes. Manufacturers shall be contacted regarding donations of snowmobiles and merchandise. Cash prizes may be derived from the pool of lottery income.

## **III. DATE OF THE DRAW**

The date of the draw for prizes shall be made at the discretion of the Board of Directors.

## **IV. LOTTERY LICENSE AND PRINTING OF TICKETS**

Once the prize list has been established, the General Manager shall apply to the Province for a lottery license before tickets are printed.

## **V. PRICING**

Clubs will purchase lottery tickets at \$10.00 each. Credits will be applied after the lottery draw date. Credits will be as follows.

<b>1-800 tickets sold</b>	<b>\$7.00 credit per sold ticket returned.</b>
<b>801 and over tickets sold</b>	<b>\$8.00 credit per sold ticket returned.</b>
<b>Unsold tickets</b>	<b>\$10.00 credit per unsold ticket.</b>

## **VI. MINIMUM SALES REQUIREMENTS**

All member clubs must sell a minimum of 50 lottery tickets each snowmobile season. No club shall purchase lottery tickets on behalf of the club's name.

## VII. RETURN OF TICKETS

Clubs are required to return all sold tickets to the Federation office no later than **fourteen (14) days before the draw date**. Lottery tickets sent back after the return date will incur a penalty against the club's Payouts.

## VIII. ANNOUNCEMENT OF WINNERS

Announcement of winners will be made in provincial newspapers.

## IX. PRIZE FOR TOP SALES

The club which sells the most lotto tickets will be awarded a prize valued at \$1000.00.

## X. POLICY REVIEW

This policy shall be reviewed annually and revised at the discretion of the Board of Directors.

Dear Clubs,

Please remember that accuracy is always and continues to be very important and these changes are collected all year long and reflect in September's annual Map. Changes annually need to be submitted to me no later than July 1<sup>st</sup>. Local trail location changes can be defined by club, but provincial trail location changes must be approved by SMNB Board of Directors.

The map allowance per club is based on the club survey question "how many provincial maps needed". This helps both Lisa and I annually calculate the amount of maps we should order along with a few other factors that play a role in the count.

Besides the SMNB Clubs, Provincial Trail Maps are also distributed by the SMNB Office to the following locations:

- 1) All Service New Brunswick outlets in the Province
- 2) All Snowmobile Dealerships in the Province
- 3) All SMNB Corporate Partners
- 4) Annual Snowmobile Shows in Ontario, Quebec & Maine.

We trust that you will find these maps helpful, please have a look at them from a Tourist's perspective and consider if there are any changes that would make their trip planning easier. Remember to submit any changes to me before July 1, 2025 in order for them to be reflected on the 2026 edition, I welcome your input.

This is also a requirement to be able to have mandatory trail permit legislation enforced on these trails. (along with "Managed Trail" signs)

From time to time, land is sold and changes hands, it is important to be certain that the Land Use Agreement the club holds has been signed by the current landowner.

Attached please find the list of Land Use Agreement Forms the SMNB office has on file for your club. Please advise us if there are any changes, additions, omissions or errors. You may also notice blank spaces where either there was no information on the form turned in, or it was illegible - please fill in the missing information. If there is no list attached to this memo, then the SMNB has not received your forms, please send in copies as soon as possible.

In regards to Midland Courier, there is some information that we would like to pass on to you to save you money:

- 1) In general, it costs more to delivery to a private residence versus a business address. The amount ranges between \$5.00-\$10.00.
- 2) If there is no one home at a residence when they try to deliver a package, they will attempt to deliver up to 3 times, and they charge the SMNB for each attempt.

Keep this in mind for the courier address you provide for us to send you packages, as well as the courier address you provide for your sign orders to be delivered. If there is someone in your club who works at a local business who could sign for packages, that would be a better option than home delivery.

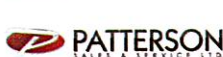

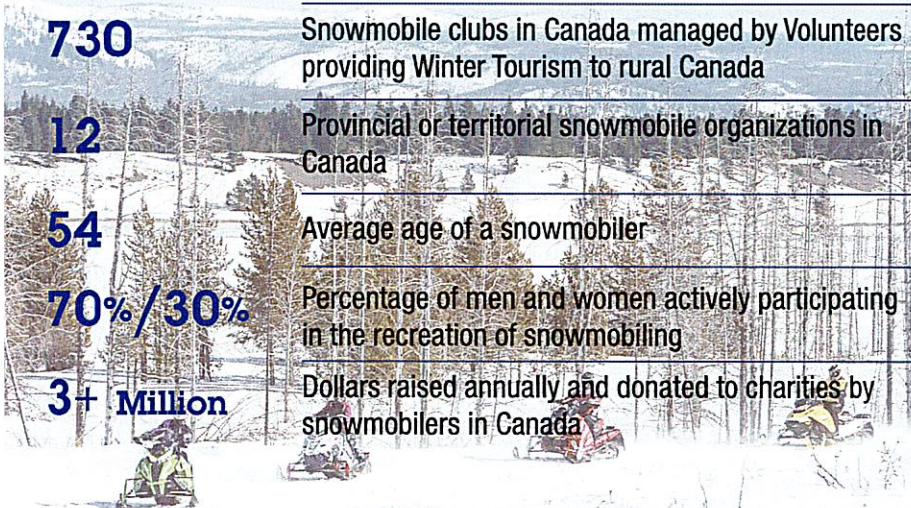

- 1** A significant portion of a typical snowmobile ride qualifies as at least moderate-intensity physical activity. Try to get 150 minutes of exercise each week. (1-8)
- 2** Physical activity performed by snowmobiling could help treat the symptoms of depression and anxiety. (1-8)
- 3** Major depressive disorder is the second leading cause of global disability, and generalized anxiety disorder affects about 5% of Canadians. (1-8)
- 4** A single bout of physical activity like snowmobiling on the weekend can have positive effects on mental health that last up to a week. (1-8)
- 5** Physical activity performed outdoors and in the wilderness is more beneficial to mental health than indoor physical activity. (1-8)
- 6** Snowmobiling with friends or family can improve mental health by increasing feelings of support and distracting from worrying<sup>2</sup>. (1-8)
